



He explained that the various solutions for the problems or needs must be worked out properly. He shared her own experience to explain the importance of IPR and Ethical Steps of Filing Patent. He also educated students to reserve their rights to their idea by introducing Intellectual Property Rights. He informed various categories like idea generation, prototyping, patent filing etc. for which students can apply for Patent and Copyright. The students were delighted by listening to the experience of the Speaker.



Workshop Agenda:



One Day Exposure Visit to industrial Unit

On 28th May 2024, the Dept of Commerce, in collaboration with Entrepreneurship Development Cell and IIC organized an industrial visit to Alpine Agro Fresh Pvt. Ltd. Lassipora Pulwama. The visit was organized and coordinated by Prof Redwan Nayeem (Head Department of Commerce and co-convenor IIC). The visit began at 9:00 am. Thirty students from the commerce department and 20 students from innovation club participated in the event. The Main aim of the industrial visit was to provide an exposure to students about entrepreneurship. Such visits also provide students a good opportunity to gain full awareness about entrepreneual practices. Through industrial visits students get awareness about new technologies. Moreover practical and other curricular activities are included as an integral part of NEP 2020 curriculum so that students can study more diligently. Similarly, an Industrial visit is a type of practical knowledge that introduces them to the working world and provides students with an insight into the corporate world. It provides students with a practical real-world perspective on different functions in organizations such as Marketing, HR, Finance, Operations, Customer Service, Logistics, etc.





After reaching the site, the team was guided by Dr. Manzoor Ahmad Ganai, Administrative Manager Alpine Agro Ltd, who provided insights regarding the different stages and processes involved in protection and storage of various horticultural produce particularly apples ,brief description about the company, revenue generation and monitoring, layout of the plant, number of employees, benefits provided by the organization to the employees, CSR activities, performance appraisal system, conflict resolution procedure, and safety measures for hazardous work, etc. He explained that with limited storage options, a significant portion of the apple harvest would often perish before reaching consumers, causing substantial losses to farmers and the economy. However, the advent of innovative controlled-atmospheric (CA) storage facilities has become a beacon of hope for farmers Equipped with cutting-edge technology, CA storage offers the perfect environment to store apples at precise temperatures, preserving their freshness and quality for extended periods. The CA storage system ensures an optimum supply of oxygen, carbon dioxide, nitrogen besides humidity and temperature to preserve edible items for longer periods of time.





Apples kept in cold-storage units in Kashmir help growers to fetch much better rates by selling their production according to their will. . Alpine Agro Fresh Private Limited, established on November 7, 2019, is a dynamic entity in the realm of horticultural solutions.
