


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World Environment Day is celebrated every year on 5th June. This year's World Environment Day campaign focuses on land restoration, desertification, and drought resilience under the slogan "Our land. Our future. We are #Generation Restoration." In connection with this, IIC GDC Pampore, Department of Environmental Science (EcoClub) in collaboration with the NSS Unit of the college celebrated World Environment Day and held a Cleanliness drive at Chandhara Spring and its outlets. The team of EVS students (Major/Minor), NSS volunteers, accompanied by NSS Programme Officers Prof.Kasira, Prof.Irtiza and Dr.IrfanKhursheed Shah (HOD, Env. Science), Dr.Shabir Hussain (HOD, Chemistry) and Dr Iqbal (HOD, Islamic studies) departed from the college at 10:30 am. The team visited the Chandhara Spring which is located at a distance of about 5 km from the college and different types of waste material were collected from the spring in the form of polythene bags, plasticbottles, shampoo wrappers and clothing and finally the said spring was thoroughly cleaned including its outlet. The cleanliness drive was followed by awarenesscampaign and interactions with the local community members. During the awareness presentation, Dr.IrfanKhursheed Shah and Prof. Iqbal Malik discussed their meaningful and inspiring thoughts for World Environment Day and suggested the essential preventative measures for managing and safeguarding the spring. Following that, the team traveled to the local government school in Kranchu, which is about 3 km from the college. There, Dr.IrfanKhursheed Shah gave a detailed lecture on this year's theme, which is land restoration and desertification, and shared his views with students. Following that, refreshments were given to the students, and finally the team returned the college back at 2:30 pm. 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

Almost 50 students and IIC members attended the meet online from different departments.



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
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


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

 Mentorship Opportunities: Providing students with access to experienced mentors from



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

On 02/08/2024 an online session was conducted by Mr. Dipan Kumar Sahu, Assistant Innovation Director, MoE's Innovation Cell at 11:00 AM

The session on "Strengthening IIC Linkages with ATLs (Atal Tinkering Labs) and SICs (School Innovation Councils) in Schools and the Framework for Providing Mentorship and Guidance" aimed to improve the innovation ecosystem spanning from educational institutions at the school level to higher education institutions (HEIs). Report of the activities held under the celebration International Youth Day (2024) by IIC along with ATL SCHOOL GOVT HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL LADHOO

To observe International Youth Day, the Govt. Degree College Pampore organized a series of activities on 28th August 2024 under the able leadership of Principal of the college, Prof. Saffiya Khalil. The event, collaboratively organized by the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), Red Ribbon Club, and the Department of Physical Education of the college, aimed at promoting youth engagement in sustainable development through digital pathways and fostering skills such as entrepreneurship. The main focus of the program was that 30 students and 5 faculty members from ATL school GOVT HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL LADHOO were the main participants.





Activities Organized:

1. Awareness Programme: An awareness programme on the theme " From Clicks to Progress: Youth Digital Pathways for Sustainable Development". The awareness programme commenced with a formal welcome address by the Principal of the college, Prof. Saffiya Khalil. In her address, she highlighted the role of youth in promoting sustainable development by adopting green skills. She emphasized the importance of youth involvement in fostering growth and effecting positive societal change. Following the Principal's address, Dr. Irfan Khurshid Shah, Convenor IIC, briefed the students on the objectives of the programme and the purpose of the IIC.
