Pre-submission Presentation of SSR

As a pre-submission preparation of SSR, IQAC organized a day long presentation program on 1st October 2021. The main objective behind the program was to collect feedback from the staff members of the college for further improvement of SSR. The main components of SSR include college profile, extended profile and the seven criteria. Hence the presentation program was divided into three parts respectively.

Presentation of College and Extended profile:

Prof. (Dr.) Seema Naz, the Principal of the college inaugurated the session by presenting the profile and extended profile of the college. She highlighted the opportunities and challenges of the college. Her expert and detailed presentation focused on the endeavour of the college administration to ensure holistic development and improvement of the college.



Presentation of Criterion 1st, 2nd and 3rd:

National Wildlife Week Celebrated

National Wildlife Week is annually celebrated across India between 2nd to 8th october with an aim to protect and preserve the flora and fauna of India. This year marked the 67th wildlife week and was celebrated with a theme "Forests and Livelihoods: Sustaining People and Planet".

In this connection the Department of Environmental Science, organized three events:

- 1. A documentary on the wildlife of J&K was screened on 05/10/2021. A total of 48 students from 1st and 2nd semesters watched the documentary. The documentary highlighted the conservation efforts of the Govt. of Jammu and Kashmir in the Dachigam National Park to save the endemic Hangul and its habitat.
- 2. An essay competition was conducted on 06/10/2021 in which the students were asked to write a brief note on any wild organism found in J&K. As many as 20 students wrote essays on different wild plants and animals of J&K. Faizan Nissar from Commerce stream stood first. He wrote a short note on Hangul. Anayat Majeed and Rukhsha Javid secured 2nd and 3rd positions respectively.
- 3. A quiz competition related to biodiversity was organized on 07/10/2021. Students from both science and commerce streams participated in the quiz. Haris Maqbool from commerce secured the first position whereas Muskan Yaseen and Muffassir Farooq from science streams secured the 2nd and 3rd positions respectively.



Mega Campus Cleanliness Drive

The NSS Unit, in collaboration with Municipal Committee Pampore, conducted a "Mega Campus Cleanliness Drive" at GDC Pampore on 06/10/2021. The drive started at 10:30 am with the cleaning of academic block and surrounding lawns that went through library block, sports ground, prefabricated huts, multipurpose hall, administrative block, car parking, all lawns and finally ended up at the main gate of the college at 2:30 pm. Around 40 NSS Volunteers of the college and 10 sweepers of Municipal Committee participated in the drive.



One day seminar on "Innovations in Saffron Cultivation"

On 06/10/2021, a one-day seminar on the theme "Innovations in Saffron Cultivation" was organized by Skill Development Committee in collaboration with ARSSS, SKAUST-K, Pampore. In this seminar, three faculty members from

ARSSS, SKAUST-K, Pampore delivered the talk on different themes related to "Innovations in Saffron Cultivation". The programme was moderated by Dr. Iqbal Malik, Co-Convener Skill Development Committee.

The programme began with the rendition of College Tarana by the students. Prof Mohd Iqbal Dar, Convener Skill Development Committee then introduced the guest speakers to the audience and gave a detailed overview of the programme schedule and the reasons behind organizing the event. This was followed by the welcome address, presented by the principal of the college, Prof. Dr. Seema Naz. She apprised the audience about the skill course in saffron cultivation, to be introduced in our college very soon. She lauded the support that was provided by the ARSSS, SKAUST-K, Dussu Pampore in this regard.

The technical session started with the presentation by Dr. M. H. Khan, Assistant Professor, GBP, ARSSS, SKAUST-K, Pampore. Dr Khan deliberated on the topics, "Overview and technological interventions" and "Mutation breeding" in saffron. He presented a detailed global scenario of saffron along with its trends in area production and productivity. The constraints related to saffron production in Jammu and Kashmir were described quite well by the speaker. He highlighted the SKUAST-K, technologies for enhancing saffron production. His talk ended with the discussion on mutation breeding in saffron and the speaker also made a special mention of Shalimar Saffron that has been developed and produced by SKUAST-K, a contribution in the field which shall be unveiled in near future to the growers.

The next presentation was made by Dr. Asif Iqbal Qureshi, Assistant Professor, GBP, ARSSS, SKAUST-K, Pampore, on the topic, "Post-harvest handling in Saffron". Dr. Asif gave a detailed overview of the Saffron, its life cycle and current status. The post harvesting technology implemented in saffron was discussed in detail. He highlighted the reasons for the reduction in saffron. A case study highlighting the effect of various parameters on the saffron quality was elaborated by the esteemed speaker. Towards the end of his lecture, the guest speaker deliberated on the expected outcome/impact of the technology. He also mentioned a procedure to identify the natural saffron from the adulterated or artificial saffron. His talk was followed by the final presentation on the topic, "Saffron improvements under in vitro conditions" by Dr. N. A. Dar.



He gave an overview of various techniques and procedures involved in in vitro conditions. A very detailed presentation was made on the plant tissue culture technique by the Guest speaker. A question answer session was held at the end of the programme. All the queries raised by the audience were addressed by the esteemed speakers. At the end of the programme, a release ceremony of syllabus for the skill course in saffron cultivation was held after which Dr. Asif introduced the syllabus to the audience. Prof. Hilal Bakhshi, HOD Physics delivered the vote of thanks.



Session on "Creative Art from Waste Material"

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell organised a session on the theme "Creative Art from Waste Material" on 7th of October, 2021. The resource person Bhushan Bhat from Rajasthan instructed the students on arts and craft using waste paper. He used the trash papers, glossy papers as well as the new wrapping papers and turned them into beautiful flower crafts, wall paper cart etc. Paper flowers like this are an easy craft project and budget-friendly decor for homes, weddings, parties, or as gifts. Students not only had

fun while learning this kind of art activity but this activity was useful as it helped create awareness among students to use the waste products in best possible manner. It also helped in generating the awareness and building the attitude to take up activities in real world. Students learned that recycling and reusing the valuable waste material can result in development of fantastic and usable products. The objective was also to encourage Mr Bhushan who was travelling from Rajasthan as we strongly believe in inclusion and equity at our institution.



One day Seminar on "World Mental Health Day"

A one-day seminar on "World Mental Health Day" was organized on 11th October 2021 by Psychological Counselling Cell, in collaboration with Child Guidance and Well-being Centre (CGWC) IMHANS-Kashmir. The theme of World Mental Health Day was "Mental Health in Unequal World." Prof Shah Lateef, Convenor Psychological Counselling Cell, moderated the entire programme. The programme was divided in to three sessions viz., Inaugural, technical and concluding session. In the inaugural ceremony, Principal of the college, Prof. (Dr.) Seema Naz formally welcomed the chief guest of the



occasion, Mr. Zaffer Hussain Shawl (KAS), ADC, Awantipora, Guest of honour, Dr. Reyaz, Medical officer Pulwama, Special guest, Mr. Muzaffar Ahmad, Clinical Psychologist (CHWC) IMHANS-K and other respected speakers. The Principal deliberated on mental Health and the services provided by the Psychological Counselling Cell of the institution. The guest of honour, Mr. Zaffer Hussain Shawl (KAS) ADC, Awantipora highlighted the stigma pertaining to mental health issues and coming forward for the treatment of mental health problems. The technical session started with power point presentation on "Understanding Mental Health "by Mr. Muzaffar Ahmed Clinical Psychologist (CGWC) IMHANS. Mr Muzaffar gave a detailed presentation on Mental Health symptoms, causes and treatment strategies. Then, Mr. Jagmeet Singh, counsellor (CGWC) IMHANS-K presented a power point presentation on prevention of suicide and thereby emphasised on demography of suicide in India, methods, risk-factors, symptoms and prevention of suicide. Syed Mujtaba, coordinator (CHWC) IMHANS presented a detailed presentation on "mental health in an unequal world" He stressed on mental health rights and deficiency in terms of man power and infrastructure. The last presentation was given by Ms. Tawseef Rashid, psychiatric social worker (CHWC) IMHANS on psycho-social perspective to mental health. She made her session lively by active participation of students. The seminar concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Prof. Aaliya Bashir, Dean Students.





Two-day training workshop on Drug De-Addiction

Two-day training workshop on drug de-addiction was organised by Psychological Counselling Cell, in collaboration with District Social Welfare office, Pulwama and IMHANS-K, SMHS, Srinagar on 27th and 28th october, 2021. Students from various semesters along with faculty of psychology, Education and English actively participated in this programme. It was moderated by Mr. Adil (Faculty IMHANS). Sessions of day one were conducted by team of experts from IMHANS. Dr. Fazl gave detailed presentation on drug addiction; its types, harms, problems, and its overall impact. He also deliberated on the overall scenario of drug addiction in the world, particularly in India and Kashmir as well. This session was carried forward by presentation of Dr. Rouf who acquainted participants with early recognition of substance use. The expert also talked about various indicators and counselling strategies used by the experts in the said field. Sessions of day two were conducted by Dr. Muzaffar (faculty IMHANS) wherein he made participants aware about various interventions adopted by experts for treatment of drug addiction. Training was concluded by the last session in which participants interacted with some substance users under rehabilitation.






Celebration of "National Education Day"

One day Cultural and Heritage Tour under EBSB.

To commemorate Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, the Department of Environmental Science, EBSB Club and cultural committee of GDC Pampore conducted one day cultural and heritage tour on 30th of November, 2021. Tour included a visit to following places;

- 1 Shikargah: a dense forest, an erstwhile hunting ground of Maharaja of J&K and now important Hangul conservation site
- 2. Megalithic site at Tral
- 3 Cave dwelling dating to 2500 BC
- 4 Awantipora temple ruins dating back to 855 to 883 AD in district Pulwama. Shikargah is situated at a distance of about 3 Km from Tral town and around 40 Km from Srinagar. It is located in the middle of a vast stretch of dense woods which was traditionally a favourite hunting place for the Royals. Maharaja Hari Singh (1925-1947) used to visit the place for wild life hunting. However, at present, Shikargah is an important Hangul Conservation and Breeding Centre and an attractive tourist spot. Megalithic site at Tral is a cluster of scattered unique ceremonial megaliths with the biggest referred to as Sha mar Pal. Guf kral, which according to some historians is a place where the first men reaching the valley on early Neolithic period settled. Currently there are 20-25 houses of potters, who continue their traditional profession of pottery making since Neolithic period. A total of 35 Neolithic caves have been discovered in the area. The caves of Guf kral are one of the oldest in Kashmir and some estimates trace their origin to 2000-3000 BC. Even the name of the area Guf (cave) Kral (Potter) comes from these caves (potters' caves). The caves have an enormous archaeological value.

The tour was concluded at Avanti Shovra Temple ruins in Awantipora, Pulwama. The complex hosted two temples, one each for Shiva and Vishnu. The temples were built by King Avanti Varman of the Utpala dynasty in the 9th century A.D. The site is maintained by Archaeological Survey of India. Locals call the temples Pandav Lari, which means "House of Pandavas." The tour was coordinated by Dr Irfan Khursheed Shah HOD EVS.



Submission of SSR for 1st Cycle of NAAC

Team IQAC comprising of Prof. Shah Lateef, Coordinator IQAC, Dr. Shabir Hussain Lone, Co-coordinator IQAC and Mr. Shahnawaz Bhat, Technical Assistant, submitted the SSR for the NAAC Assessment and Accreditation Process on 1st December 2021. DVV clarifications were submitted on 24/12/2021.



Department of History organizes tour to historical sites under Clean India Programme.

The NSS Unit of College, in collaboration with Department of History, organized a visit to the historical sites of Surya Temple Anantnag, Avantiswami and Avantiswara temples of Awantipora Pulwama under the CLEAN INDIA PROGRAMME on 1st December 2021. The significant **Surya Temple** which is presently in ruins is the specimen of most beautiful monument in Kashmir situated 11 kms away from Anantnag town. The Martand Surya Temple also known as **Pandou Laidan** is a Hindu temple dedicated to Surya (the chief solar deity in Hinduism) and built during the 8th century CE. Martand is another Sanskrit synonym for Surya. The students also visited the modern **Sun Temple** which is four kilometres away from the Martand situated in a village named Mattan. On returning, the two temples at Awantipora, constructed by Raja Avantivarman of Utpala dynasty were also visited. On spot knowledge have been imparted to students about the art and architecture, the students

also easily understand the importance of national heritage and the role of monumental sites in tourism. The history tour enhanced the knowledge and experience of the students to a great extent.



Visit to Voluntary Medical Society on the eve of "International Day of Persons with Disabilities"

On 3rd December, 2021, Psychological Counseling Cell, Govt. Degree College, Pampore organised training cum awareness Programme in collaboration with Voluntary Medical Society, Bemina on the eve of International Day of Persons with Disabilities."The workshop was commenced with a motivational play that paid special tribute to a child with special needs - Zubair. A Koshur Ro'f (traditional song and dance) piece themed "Sakoon" by spinal injury and PPRP patients that followed created a melodious aura. A skit was performed by students of Shafaqat Special School on "Covid-19 and our special Children." This was followed by speech of Prof. Hemayun from SKIMS who not only appreciated the worthy services of VMS for our children with special needs, but also laid emphasis on empowerment and rehabilitation of disabled people to accommodate them back in the society without adopting any discriminatory approach towards them. An informational session held by Mr. Dildar, a survivor and activist on 'Prevention of Spinal Cord injury' emphasized the role of adopting safety measures to prevent spinal cord injury. He also highlighted the measures to be taken at individual, societal and governmental levels to prevent recurrence of such untoward incidents. Next an awareness play 'Lakht-e-jigar' was performed to draw attention to challenges of specially-abled children. It was followed by a skit on "Impact of Covid-19 on persons with disabilities" performed by students of Shafagat Special School (SSS) and Shafagat Intuitive School (SIS). The programme concluded with an interaction between our students and the parents of a few specially-abled children which was aimed at garnering a first-hand experience of challenges of parenting such children. One-day Legal Awareness Programme on 'Offenses against Women under Indian Penal Code'

A one-day Legal Awareness Programme on 'Offences against Women under Indian Penal Code' was organized on 23rd December 2021, under the aegis of 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav'. Prof Aijaz Manzoor HOD Political Science delivered the keynote lecture while Dr Iqbal Malik HOD Islamic Studies moderated the session. The aim of the lecture was to sensitize the students, who come under young-adult category of the rights of women, and the detriments of crimes against women.

The event was attended by faculty and more than 90 students. Prof Ajaz illuminated the audience about the diverse nature, categorisation and penalties attracted by crime against women to create awareness on the issue. Commencing the program, Dr Malik provided a historical overview of role of women in sustaining civilisation and patriarchal oppression of women, which drew attention to the necessity of laws to prevent/redress grievances of women. Prof Aijaz spoke next and started by providing the broader classification of laws into civil and criminal law, substantive and executive law on the basis of their functions. The offences against women fall under the purview of criminal and executive law.

Next, the lecture drew attention to the need for laws to ensure deterrence for crimes against women drawing on statistics and surveys provided and conducted by likes of Thomson Reuters. Particular focus was placed on the two amendments enacted after the infamous 2013 Nirbhaya Rape and Murder case: punishment for stalking and punishment for voyeurism. Both categories were explained in detail and penalties accrued by committing offences under these categories were detailed as well. The session concluded with a formal vote of thanks by Prof. Mohd Iqbal Dar.



One day Seminar on "Awareness and Rehabilitation Program on Drug Abuse/ Addiction under National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction"

One day Awareness and Rehabilitation Program on Drug Abuse/Addiction under National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction was organized by Psychological Counseling Cell in collaboration with District Social Welfare Office Pulwama on 14/12/2021 in the multipurpose hall. The program was attended by 130 participants. The formal proceedings of the Program began with reciting the college tarana. The moderator of the program, Prof. Shah Lateef, while deliberating on the backdrop of the program, highlighted the importance of National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction. He mentioned the historical background of drug menace in India with special references of Golden triangle and Golden Crescent. Prof. Hilal Ahamd Bakshi presented the welcome address to all the dignitaries and students from south Kashmir colleges. He deliberated on the growing concern of the drug abuse.

The panel discussed about law enforcing agencies in curbing drug menace, the common reason for drug menace and role of religious scholars and saints in rehabilitation of substance abusers. After panel discussion, a skit with the theme "Say No to Drugs and Yes to Life" was played by a group of students under the supervision of cultural committee of the college. The session was moved on by the proceeding of Dr. Yasir Rather. He highlighted in detail about the drug menace as psychoactive drugs which change the brain chemistry and the usual use of the drugs damages the brain circuit. 
The event started with a welcome address by the patron of the webinar – Dr Seema Naz, Principal. In her address, she outlined the contours of the webinar – the relevance and need of the philosophical ideals of Swami Vivekananda. She drew attention to his philosophical ideal of education as an instrument of humanising that is of immense importance in the challenge to counter the dehumanising tendency of modernity.



This was followed by an extension lecture on the theme by the resource person. Prof Lateef started by stressing on the relevance of Swami Vivekananda's philosophy, with special reference to its insistence on self-introspection to build character. He proceeded then to examine Vivekananda's blending of eastern metaphysics with western analytical rigour, and outlined the major milestones of his career including the legendary lecture at World Religious Meet held in 1893. The lecture also deliberated on Vivekananda's insistence on the greatness of man, and manifestation of God in man as a prelude to his untiring belief in universalism and inclusivity. The lecture concluded by emphasising the relevance of this paradigm of inclusivity as a cure to a world riddled by divisiveness. A question-and-answer session followed in which the audience presented its questions, and comments on the lecture. The webinar concluded with a formal vote of thanks delivered by Dr Shabir Hussain Lone.


Extension lecture on 'Career Opportunities in Chemical Sciences'

Under the aegis of IQAC, the Department of Chemistry, in collaboration with 'Career Counselling and Guidance Cell' organised an extension lecture on 'Career Opportunities in Chemical Sciences' on Saturday, 22nd January 2022. The resource person for the lecture was Dr. Aamir Hanif, Post-Doctoral Scholar, and Chemistry at Hong Kong Quantum, Al Lab, and University of Hong Kong. Dr. Aamir has considerable experience in scientific pedagogy besides his extensive research, and was thus an ideal expert to talk to and inspire science undergraduates. The session was moderated by Dr. Shabir Hussain Lone, HOD Department of Chemistry. The event commenced with a formal welcome address by the Principal, Dr. Seema Naz who outlined the need for such lectures. She noted that in the current world, old orders and hierarchies have been upturned and a pressing need exists for preparing students at the earliest for the challenges and requirement of the job sector. In his detailed lecture, Dr. Aamir first outlined the need for clarity and conviction in the choice of a career, especially as the judgement of the student tends to be clouded by the myriad suggestions and demands made by families and peers. He, then, proceeded systematically to outline the options and careers available to students' at all three levels - graduate, masters and research level, the demands, remuneration, profile and number each increase at every stage.



At the graduate level, students can work as research assistants to gain useful experience of the field, and bolster their CVs as they aim for good institutes like IITs and IISCs. Students can apply for various scholarships like Turkish Bursary Scholarships to obtain fully funded masters. Dr Aamir reminded the students that often world class institutes in the middle-east like Kind Fahad University are often not on their radar even as they offer top of class infrastructure, and highest scholarships. The lecture proceeded to offer students guidance on careers like Instrument Application Scholarship, Scientist and Quality Control Officer after Masters and PhD. He also shared the links to various online platforms and communities like JK Scientists on Facebook that offer aspiring researchers and science students personalised mentorship. A detailed question and answer session concluded the lecture.

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Community Outreach Program organized under Swastha Balak-Balika Spardha Scheme


World Wetland Day Celebrated






and taught the students many techniques to write a good CV. The session was followed by a question and answer session. Many students and faculty members participated in the session.

On the eve of the National Science Day, the college organised its maiden one day long special celebration on 28th February 2022. The day is celebrated every year on a particular theme to commemorate the discovery of Raman Effect by the Nobel Prize winning Indian Scientist C.V Raman on February 28, 1928. The theme of this year's day was 'Integrated Approach in Science and Technology for Sustainable Future'. The event was well attended by all faculty and nearly 90 students, as it was graced by a stellar list of resource persons from eminent organizations and guests from various colleges. The resource personnel included Dr Sabi-ud-din Mufti, officer in Charge Bhabha Atomic Research Centre Srinagar, Dr Muzamil Ahmad, Principal Scientist, Neuropharmacology Division, CSIR-IIIM, Br. Srinagar, and Dr Mohd Ashraf Shah, Senior Associate Professor Laboratory for Multifunctional Nanomaterials (LMN), P.G Department of Physics National Institute of Technology Srinagar. The event was moderated by Dr. Shabir Hussain Lone, Programme Coordinator and HOD, Chemistry. celebrations commenced with a rendition of the college tarana that set off the spirit of commemoration. Next, the resource persons and audience were accorded a formal yet warm welcome by Dr Seema Naz, Principal. She emphasised on the importance of science, and its deep and inextricable links to our daily lives. Her address also highlighted the efforts made by the college to cultivate a scientific temperament in its students including acquiring a permanent affiliation for the science stream, and developing new and state of art laboratories to increase enrolment, and offer a more quality academic experience to the students of science streams. The first technical session was helmed by Dr Mufti who delivered a detailed and informative talk on "Research Activities at BARC". The talk elaborated on the



various constituent units of BARC including Multidisciplinary High-Altitude laboratory at Gulmarg and research lab at Srinagar as well the specialised equipment available at them including Lead free Neutron Monitor (LFGNM) and IGY Neutron Monitor to conduct research on cosmic phenomenon. Further the talk focused on specialised equipment like Panoramic Batch Irradiator (PANBIT) installed in 1983 which has use in radiational sterilization of various medical equipment and horticulture produce to increase its life. The resource person also navigated the students across tricky scientific phenomenon like constitutions of cosmic rays with the aid of detailed schematic representations and graphs. Dr Mohd Farooq Mir, Principal GDC Tral and Prof. Farooq Ahmed Andrabi, Principal GDC















Pulwama, renowned academician addressed the students in light of the theme of the day. Dr Muzamil Ahmed was the resource person for the second technical session titled: 'Neurodegenerative diseases with special focus on Stroke'. The resource person started with an introduction to the brain and its functions including its constitution and energy requirements. Further, the lecture explored the phenomenon of stroke, various types of strokes, conditions that precipitate it, symptoms of stroke and the possibilities of intervention. The lecture focused specifically on risk factors which are quite prominent and prevalent in Kashmir like smoking and substance abuse. The lecture provided a detailed inventory of markers of a stroke – the warning signs to generate awareness about the phenomenon and provide immediate medical care to the affected person. A detailed section on the need for research intervention into stroke was also included in the lecture to motivate students to consider it as a career choice. Professor Mohd Ashraf Shah helmed the third technical session on 'Science for the benefit of Humanity'. The lecture focuses on the interventions by science made for advancement and improvement of mankind including medical treatments. He highlighted recent advances like introduction of nano- fertilisers for an eco-friendly green revolution to make the region self-sufficient in food production. Particular focus was lent on the need to be curious in students. and the encouragement of curiosity by teachers. He extended an open invitation to the students to visit NIT Srinagar and familiarise themselves with the latest progress of technology. The vote of thanks for first session was delivered by Prof Hilal Bakshi – HOD Physics who expressed his gratitude to resource persons for sharing their expertise, and the audience for listening patiently to the presenters. Post Lunch a poster presentation session was held in which students presented well researched and detailed posters on various topics like Tornado formation and Cancer Prevention. The posters were evaluated by a team of experts comprising of Prof. Hilal Ahmad Bakhshi, Prof. G. N. Joo and Dr. Kausar. Nailah Nisar of 2nd Semester, Roll No: 433 who delivered the presentation on "The Chemistry of Different Colours of Blood" got first position. Qurat Mehraj of 2nd Semester, Roll No: 486 who delivered a talk on "Biology of Cancer" bagged 3rd position. Another Student Humaira Jan, student of 2nd semester, Roll No 491 who presented a talk on "Endangered and Extinct Animal Species bagged third position in this competition. Certificates were distributed among all the students who participated in the poster competition. However the 1st three position holders were awarded both participation certificate as well as cash prize. The programme ended with a vote of thanks presented by Prof, Shah Lateef, and Coordinator IQAC.

Three-day celebrations on eve of International Women's Day

On the eve of the International Women's Day on 8th March, the college held a 3-day festival from 8th to 10th March on the theme 'Breaking the Bias' under the aegis of 'Azaadi ka Mahaotsav'. The festival was organized by





Women's Development Cell in corroboration with School of Languages, Department of Music and Department of Physical Education at the virtual lab and the multipurpose hall of the college.

The first day of the festival titled – 'Tete a Tete' involved a series of conversations with eminent Kashmiri women from various fields. Professor Neerja Matoo – noted academic, author and translator of repute was the chief guest on the occasion. Other dignitaries included Narjees Nawab, Deputy Legal lawyer, Syed Sleet Shah - Deputy Superintendent Police, Headquarters, Azra Mufti - State Resource Coordinator, IIM Jammu, and Sehar Nazir – Legal Researcher at High Court of Jammu Kashmir and Ladakh, Acid AttackSurvivor and activist. The event was well attended by all faculty, and more than 120 girl students.

In her inaugural address, the principal - Dr Naz extended a warm welcome to the invitees and hoped that their standing as women of eminence would inspire the students especially girl students to give wing to their imagination, and dream of soaring beyond limitations. Prof Naz reserved a special welcome to Prof Matoo, her former teacher, and recounted her stellar contributions to the literary community. She highlighted the need for empowering the women and the need to counter patriarchal biases and misogyny - efforts which have suffered a great setback due to the pandemic which doubly marginalised women by making them vulnerable to abuse and poverty. The address highlighted the need for promoting equality and equity at the grassroots level so that a harmonious society can be evolved. The celebrations were kicked off on a festive note by a musical skit by students of the college based on the life of Habba Khatoon – the renowned poetess of Pampore whose verses still resound in the collective memory of Kashmir. Dramatizing her sufferings at the hands of her husband and in-laws, the skit highlighted how Habba transcended these obstacles, and created a poetry of such pathos and grief out of her personal misery. The series of conversations were inaugurated next by Narjees Nawab who dwelled on the skit presented by students, and drew out the relevance of it by pointing out the perpetuity of patriarchy and pervasive hetero-patriarchy that prioritises marriage for women. Drawing from her own experience as a member of erstwhile State Women's Commission, she highlighted the need for financial independence of women. She ruminated particularly on the tolerance of abuse of women, and the role of financial dependence in perpetuating this pattern and acceptance of abuse. Next, Syed Sleet Shah spoke to the students and started by focusing on the need to counter and challenge patriarchal stereotypes. She highlighted the micro-strategies that can be adopted by women to create incremental changes in society that would go a long way towards empowering women. She spoke of her own experience in training with seven hundred men as she opted for the nonconventional field of police services which involved a rigorous training regime that tested both mental and physical strength. Only a strong and unwavering belief in herself aided her in completing this punishing regimen, which proves in retrospect that women can break any glass ceilings of





biases and stereotypes. Next, Azra Muffi spoke to the students on the need of educating not just women, but also men in understanding the various actors complicit in perpetuating patriarchy. She spoke on the need to cherish and evolve counter-patriarchal solidarities with both genders to challenge the transmission of patriarchy especially through women. By drawing from her personal experience, she highlighted the need to evolve mental strength and the capacity to dream to achieve. One way to do it, she pointed out, was to follow the maxim "Choose your battles wisely". She concluded with pointing out that "The Future belongs to those who believe in the beauty of their dreams." Next Sehar Nazir recounted her story as an Acid attack survivor, which she insisted, was not to draw sympathy but seek inspiration to rise above challenges the least of which involved 26 surgeries and loss of sight in one eye. She spoke evocatively on the way she fought off despair and doom in the aftermath of the attack, and the role of love in overcoming the catastrophe to stand back on her feet. She insisted on cultivating hope, perseverance, empathy, strength and determination which helped her complete her studies in time, and embark on a career of research and activism. Her address concluded with the message "Giving up is not an option." Next was the special address by Prof Neerja Matoo, who dwelt upon the talks by previous speakers. She expressed her admiration at the skill and courage of the previous speakers and complimented it. Returning to the skit on Habba Khatoon, she pointed out the fact that Habba Khatoon is still feted today, and the others in her life are minor characters, she exposed the biases of patriarchy. In her unabashed expression, she shattered the expectation of enforced silence, and is, therefore, a great role model for women. She also drew upon the example of Lala Ded, who presents another paradigm of courage by women. Her address insisted on women developing the capacity to think and inquire, rather than blind subservience to empower themselves. She concluded her speech with an exhortation to celebrate and cherish Kashmiri womanhood. The session concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Prof Alam Ara – HoD Sociology and Co-ordinator WDC Cell.

On 9th March, the Physical Education Department held an Inter-class badminton tournament for the girl students. The tournament commenced with an inaugural address by the Principal – Prof Dr Seema Naz. Her address focused on the maxim, "A Healthy mind resides in a healthy body". The college therefore places great stress on organising such events regularly for students. Over the tournament, 18 singles matches and 8 double matches were held. 175 girl students from various semesters of the college participated in these matches and put a stellar show for the audience. The doubles tournament was won by Tehmeena Jan & Insha Hassan of 2nd semester, while Insha Farooq & Amina Maqbool of 3rd semester emerged as the runners up. In the singles tournament, Irtiqa Nazir of 4th Semester emerged as the winner, while Khushboo Farooq of 3rd semester was the runner up.





On the third day of the three-day festival to celebrate 'International Women's Day', the college organized a poetry recitation and a musical tribute to Rai Beaum. The events held in the virtual lab were organized jointly by School of Languages and the Department of Music. The sessions were moderated by Dr Pervez Ahmed, Head, and Department of Urdu. All sessions were well attended by all faculty and Students. The day started with an inaugural address by the Principal – Prof. Dr. Seema Naz. In her address, she dwelt upon the role of humanities and music in structuring a more equitable system that can strike at the roots of entrenched patriarchy. She reminded the audience that the celebrations are not acknowledgement of a day, but rather a pledge towards an inclusive and perpetual quest towards creating a kinder and more equal world. The college is committed to this world view, and therefore endeavours to provide students especially girls with multiple platforms to showcase their talent. Next followed a rendition of a soulful naat by Majid who paid liege to the last prophet of Islam, Prophet Mohamad (PBUH) to set the ambience for the day. The rendition was followed by poetry recitation where students read a wide range of poetry texts in multiple languages by about women. In their powerful recitations ranging from their own works, to poets like Maya Angelou, Parveen Shakir and our own Nighat Sahiba, the students celebrated the spirit of defiance, protest and resilience that characterises women. Iconic poems like Angelou's 'Still I rise', Kaifi Azmi's Aurat and Parveen Shakir's Woh tau Khushboo hai inspired the audience to think deeply about the feminist politics. More than twelve students participated in the session, and provided a glimpse into the talents overflowing in students. Dr Samiullah – Head, Department of Kashmiri also recited a nazm written by him in protest against the violence inflicted on women as it dwelled on the need for change at a collective level.

The recitation of poetry was followed by a musical tribute to the legendary singer of Kashmir Raj begum who continues to enthral her listener's years after her death as she did during her lifetime. A mesmerising rendition by Aqeel Nabi of Raj Begum's famed ghazal *Mashravthas Jaanani* to the accompaniment of guitar inaugurated the proceedings. It set the tone for what proved to be a very musical and sonorous session. The vote of thanks was delivered by Dr Huzaifa Pandit, Assistant Professor English.

One Day International Conference on 'Recent Advancements and Approach in Islamic Studies Discipline'

A One Day International Conference on 'Recent Advancements and Approach in Islamic Studies Discipline' was organized by the department of Islamic Studies, on 15th march 2022 in blended mode over google meet in the virtual lab. Reputed scholars from all over the globe and the country attended the conference and deliberated upon the new vistas and research approaches that have emerged in contemporary times. They included Professor Hamidullah Marazi, Director Center of Spiritual Studies, IUST, Professor Abdul Rashid Bhat, Professor of Islamic Studies, IUST, Dr. Mohamad Obaidullah founder IBF Net Indonesia and Dr. Afroz Ahmed Bisati, Head, Department of Islamic Studies IUST. The conference was moderated by Dr Iqbal Malik HoD Islamic Studies, and rapporteur duties were performed by Dr Huzaifa Pandit (Assistant Professor, English). The event commenced



with a melodious recitation of Quranic verses by Asmat Jan of BA- II to invoke divine blessings and set the atmosphere for what promised to be a spiritual fest. It was followed by a welcome address delivered by Prof Aijaz Mansoor – HoD Political Science. His address extended a warm welcome to the participants and resource persons for consenting to attend the event. He also dwelt on the rationale of the conference and the research gap it aimed to highlight. Drawing from the Quranic injunction of quest for knowledge and renowned commentaries, the address highlighted the need to counter allegations of intellectual stagnation and dogma to expand the horizon of Islamic studies and explore the dialectics of Islamic scholarship and secular sciences. To that end, the conference aims to expand upon these contours while reinvestigating and regenerating the context of Islamic studies.

Inaugural Session: The inaugural session commenced with the key note address delivered by Prof Hameed Naseem Rafiabadi on 'Recent trends and advancements in Islamic Social Sciences'. His address started with outlining the genesis of Islamic studies as a formal discipline, and its journey from western academia (where it began as an attempt to understand oriental muslim subjectivities in order to aid colonial project) to east and especially Kashmir. Outlining the hegemony of the western academia in the field, he highlighted that the eastern academia has largely been reactive to the agendas and paradigms set by oriental studies, even as efforts have been undertaken in recent times to redraft the pedagogy and ontological paradigms of the field. Highlighting the divisions in oriental approaches he drew upon its various approaches ranging from sympathetic to outright hostility. Next, Prof. Dr. Obaidullah spoke on the topic "Scope of Fin Tech in Islamic Economic system". He elaborated on the concept of Fin Tech, and its evolution as a system of investigation. Drawing upon the principles outlined by Sharia, he outlined the scope of blending the approaches of modern economics and artificial intelligence to create an alternative non capitalist financial universe. The inaugural session concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Dr Parvez Ahmed, HoD Urdu who thanked the experts for their illuminating addresses

First Technical Session: The first technical session comprising of five papers was held next, which was chaired by Dr Altaf Hussain Yatoo. Papers were read by Prof Ab Rashid Bhat, Dr Afroz Ahmed Bisati, Dr Showkat Hussain Dar, Dr Nazir Ahmed Zargar and Mr Ather Shahbaz. The session was begun by Prof Bhat who read a paper on 'Recent trends and advancements in Islamic Social Sciences'. He outlined the intersections between social sciences and Islamic studies by tracing first the genealogies of social science as a field of academic inquiry and linking it to the Islamic principles of knowledge production like study of Tawheed within blended frameworks. Next, Dr Showkat Hussain Dar, Sr. Assistant Professor spoke on 'Multidisciplinary views of Islamic Education." He started by dwelling on the trend of 'tawasul 'tarfayn and provided an inventory on various thematic approaches to Islamic studies





like Islamic Social Sciences with concurrent themes like Islamic Economics and Islamic Stylistics. He delved into the differing approaches and their impact on the knowledge production in the Islamic studies world. The final presentation of the session was delivered by Mr Ather Shehbaz Doctoral scholar at IUST who spoke on 'Islamic Finance: An emerging academic discipline'. He drew on the two sectors of the discipline: 1) corporate sector based on principles of profit and loss 2) The Academic sector that seeks to theorise and lay out the ground for transactions in the corporate sector A brief question and answer session followed in which the paper presenters answered the questions raised by the audience.

Technical Session 2: The second technical session comprised of four papers which dwelled on the diverse aspects of the theme deliberated upon. The session was chaired by Dr. Abida Qounser, Assistant Professor GDC Sopore. The session commenced with a paper by Dr. Rabia Siddiqui who deliberated on 'Anthropology and Islam: recent Developments." The presentation focused on the evolution of the field which is of quite recent origins and orients the audience towards an anthropological framework of Islamic studies. Her presentation commenced with a brief exploration of the basics of anthropology and its field of study as rooted in human experience and life. The next paper was read by Dr. Rabia Siddigi, who spoke on 'Recent inclusions in feminism and a Muslim response". The paper dealt with an issue that has generated much debate in recent times especially with the evolution of Islamic Feminism. The paper commenced with an exploration of the evolution of feminism as a political movement as a reaction to scripturally and socially sanctioned disparity of power between men and women. Next Javeed Ahmed Malik, spoke on 'Philanthropy in Sirah Literature: A Contemporary relevance' which highlighted the initiatives of Prophet (PBUH) regarding philanthropy, the concept of philanthropy, types of philanthropy and the need to mandate it in light of scripture and tradition. A question-andanswer session followed in which the experts addressed the questions and queries raised by the audience.

Valedictory Ceremony: The ceremony started with a brief report of the conference delivered by Prof Iqbal Malik, Convenor of the Conference. The Valedictory address that followed was delivered by the Principal and Patron of the conference: Dr Seema Naz. She outlined the importance of endeavours like research conferences to not only outline the progress of knowledge but also build capacities in scholars and students by orienting them towards latest advances in research. She reiterated that the implementation of NEP demands that research and pedagogy be interlinked more intricately, and by organising the conference, the college is taking a step in this direction. She offered her congratulations to the department for conceptualising the conference with such a galaxy of luminaries. Certificates were then distributed among the participants and the session ended on a formal note of thanks delivered by Prof Hilal Ahmad Bakshi (HoD Physics).


Mega-plantation drive held at GDC Pampore

Five Day Training Program on Post Cocoon Technology

Sericulture is an agro-based industry, involving rearing of silkworms for the production of raw silk being the yarn obtained out of cocoons, spun by certain species of insects. Sericulture is the skill development subject prescribed by University of Kashmir on the curriculum of 5th and 6th semesters at UG level. It is with this intention that Department of Zoology GDC Pampore attended the 5 Days training programme on Post Cocoon Technology (PCT) at Central Sericulture Research and training Institute, Pampore (CSRTI). The training programme imparted students, immense theoretical and Practical scientific knowledge. The program was initiated by Director CSRTI. Dr. Sardar Sing and briefed overview of sericulture industry in India. The session continued by Dr. Gulab Khan Scientist-C delivered lecture on Mulberry



cultivation techniques-propagation and plantation cultivation techniques. Dr Pawan Sani Scientist-C demonstrated the practical on Propagation and painting cultivation techniques. Lecture on importance of disinfection and hygiene in silkworm rearing was delivered by Dr. Bharat Kumar, on same topic, Fayaz Ahmad Bhat Senior Technical Officer has shown it practically. On the second day Dr. Shiv Kumar, Scientist-C delivered lecture on silkworm rearing (early and late rearing). Dr. Rajesh Kumar Scientist-C, delivered lecture on Management of pests and disease in Mulberry and silkworm rearing and their management practices. Dy. Director Sericulture Jammu & Kashmir UT, Gh. Nabi Mir, delivered lecturer on procurement of cocoons and sorting techniques. Senior Techinical Assistant Mohd. Altaf Koul showed the practical in the rearing section on cocoon drying and store management techniques. Students visited Mulberry farm section to expose different species of Mulberry trees which are cultivated by the CSRTI, Pampore. On 3rd day Sri. Mohd. Altaf Koul delivered on introduction to reeling and brushing. Mohd Aafan Zafan resource person from outside institute presented the theoretical introduction about weaving of silkworm. Senior Techinical Assistant Mohd. Altaf Koul demonstrated to students in the reeling laboratory on reeling process on Cocoons of silkworm. On the 4th day Sri. Mohd. Altaf Koul delivered lecture as well as practical in the laboratory on identification of different types of yarns/silk. He also showed theoretically and practically silk testing and its importance. On the 5th day Sri. S Hamid Khan, Scientist-C (Assistant Director) delivered lecture on introduction to silk carpet weaving/ different types of carpet designs in the Kashmir valley. He also delivered lecture on slik market scheme and its importance. The students have also visited the Central Sericulture Research and Training Institute Library were they have seen different Journals of Sericulture of both national and international repute as well as books on Sericulture.







Field trip of Biological students to ICAR- Centre Institute of Temperate Hoticulture (CITH), Old Air Field, Rangreth Srinagar

As an initiative to boost the moral and to inculcate scientific temper among



B.Sc students, The department of science arranged a field trip of 2nd and 3rd semester students to Centre Institute of Temperate Horticulture (CITH), Rangorth Srinagar on 26/03/2022. 36 students of Science stream along with, Prof. Hilal Ahmad Bakshi, Dean Sciences, Prof. Gh. Nabi Joo, Department of Botany and Dr. Adil Bashir Shah, Department of Zoology accompanied the students. Dr. O.C. Sharma briefly introduced about various Horticultural Research activities going in the Institute. After a thorough discussion in the conference Hall of Institute with students, all the students along with Director of Institute Dr. O.C. Sharma and other two senior scientists Dr. Mohd Abass and Dr. Javaid Igbal moved towards the lush green fields of CITH, Srinagar. Director Dr. O.C. Sharma briefed the students about the latest Research developments in the Horticulture sector that include different varieties of Walnut, Apricot, Chestnut, Cherry and Apple in the hybrid forms. High density plantation method to get greatest production and much more profit as the land day by day is shrinking due to excessive use of commercialization of land for monetary benefits. Moving to the vegetable side Dr. O.P. Sharma showed a large variety of vegetables which include cabbage, peas, Brinjal, tomato and other latest varieties in hybrid mode. Dooth Ganga water collected in a 7x105 lakh litres capacity reservoir and then use in the field which is spread about 700 kanals of land in the form of drift irrigation system. Later students were taken to an array of green house and polyhouse chambers by two senior scientists briefed our students about various technologies adopted by this centre to increase yield of different crops and keeping in view the climatic conditions (Temperate climate) of Kashmir Valley. Lastly after visiting different laboratories, molecular biology laboratory, entomology laboratory, Biotechnology laboratory were different scientists and senior technical officers have shown utilization of different instruments. The students were highly satisfied as they got acquainted with different ongoing latest development both in Horticulture as well as Agriculture sector.






Institutional Best Practices
